Fabio Sokolowicz is the Diplomatic Advisor of the Minister for Economic Affairs and Finance since the 3rd of March 2020.

He has joined the Italian diplomatic service in 1998 and has devoted his carrier mainly to multilateral diplomacy and to the Middle East.

From 2016 to 2020 he was Consul General of Italy in Jerusalem.

Between 2010 and 2016 he was at the Prime Minister's Office in Rome, where he was first Counsellor for the relations with the European States, and then became Counselor for the Mediterranean and the Middle East, and for multilateral diplomacy.

From 2006 to 2010, he served as Counselor at the Permanent Mission of Italy to the United Nations in New York. He was first part of the Italian delegation to the Security Council in 2007-2008. He then became Counsellor for the process of reform of the UN system, with a special focus on the negotiations for the reform of the UN Security Council.

His knowledge of the Middle East goes back to his previous experience in Jerusalem as Deputy Consul General at the Consulate General of Italy, between 2002 and 2006, the years of the second intifada.

Previously, he worked at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Rome at the Press and Information Service and with the Spokesman of the Minister between 2000 and 2002. Before that, between 1998 and 2000, he worked as Deputy Head of the Sub-Saharan Africa Desk at the Directorate General for Development Cooperation.

Fabio Sokolowicz graduated in Political Science at Università La Sapienza of Rome, in 1995, and is the author of articles on the prospects of cooperation between Israelis and Palestinians, and on the reform of the UN Security Council.

He is fluent in english and spanish, has a good command of french and basic communication skills in arabic and hebrew.

He was Born in Rome in 1970.
